





# RETAIL IS BROKEN

How cabi is disrupting the industry and reinventing the way women shop and work.

We've all experienced it. You walk out of a store with nothing, or at best, with something you're not completely sure of in hand. As you climb into the car, you toss your shopping bag in the backseat between the groceries, between the discarded toys and empty juice boxes, between the responsibilities, the obligations, the challenges, the frustrations of day-to-day life. Rather than the excitement of having just found a treasure, there is an uncertainty that lingers. "Did I just spend too much", "Will it work with the items in my closet," "Will he like it?"

Shopping used to be fun—a much needed break from our hectic daily lives; it was a chance to discover something new, to be taken care of, to indulge in a little fantasy, to feel beautiful. It's been so long since any of those things defined a shopping experience that we wonder if such moments ever happened at all.

Clearly, retail is broken. From not being able to find what fits to putting up with dismissive salespeople, most women are simply disheartened by the present-day shopping experience. They feel judged or ignored, they're tired of the time it takes, the stress, the uninspired looks, and the lack of confidence to choose. It's isolated and impersonal—no, that saleswoman doesn't really know you, nor does she have the skills to get to—and those few pieces in the backseat of the car don't reflect your personal style; you may never even wear them.

Skip the mall, you might think,


since everything is merely a click or a tap away these days. But those seeking respite from retail quickly discover that e-commerce is hardly an improvement. What you get when you shop online is a glut of options, but none of the joy of interacting with products: to touch them, to experience them. These sites fill a need, but it's a purely transactional one. Algorithmic style suggestions attempt to personalize from afar, but instead of delivering something fresh and original, we consistently find styles we already have plenty of, and are left longing for the excitement and wonder of discovering something new.

What a small group of women realized 16 years ago was that discovering something new required creating something new: a new way for their friends to shop that's both joyful and connected. By bringing the Fashion Experience into the home and reframing the conversation from transactional to personal, they've turned the act of shopping into a journey of self-discovery and self-assurance shared amongst friends both new and old. The mere act of getting together with girlfriends (something one rarely has an excuse to make time for these days) invites a sense of openness, community, and plain old fun that doesn't exist anywhere else.

When you work with a Stylist, when you build a relationship with somebody you can truly trust, what you get in return is a wardrobe that thoroughly works for you—that amplifies your







personal style, helps you discover your style for the very first time, or embrace new styles you never otherwise would have considered. "I just love when a lady who's having a really tough day comes to one of my shows and I find her something that makes her look and feel great. All the other women start to comment and she leaves standing tall. I've seen it transform people—it's fantastic," said Jo Perry, expounding on what she loves most about being a Stylist. The cabi Fashion Experience is about ongoing, deepening friendships-connecting people to people, not just people to product. impact on how women feel, and explained cabi Stylist Melissa Nelson.

A connection with other women. and a sense of community, has been exchanged for the demands of jobs,

family, and obligations. And an enjoyable shopping experience is an oxymoron. In offering an alternative, the women of cabi have also created an opportunity for other women to have an alternative career: their own business. "Before cabi, I was in the corporate world working as a project manager," Jo recalled. "I'd had the most wonderful jobs, I got to travel the world, but when that career ended, I really wanted to do something that was going to make a difference. I wanted to do more, I wanted to be more."

"My cabi career has afforded me the luxury of moving across the

country to help my daughter pursue her dreams. There's nothing else like that," said Michelle Kennedy, a Veteran Stylist with 22 seasons under her belt. What makes this choice unique is the freedom and flexibility doesn't come at the expense of growing a business with real financial upside.

Reflecting on the success she's enjoyed over the past five seasons, Melissa shared, "With my cabi business, I have been able to pay for the upgrades in our new home, as well as for our lawn and landscaping. We just finished our basement, and I paid for my For many women, this shift husband's graduate school specialist degree. Now I am saving for my son's college education and hope to take a few trips along the way", Jo agreed. "Having a long-term financial plan that I'm in control of is reassuring in these times of redundancies and economic uncertainty. I am confident

in being able to grow a long term business that's liberating, relevant, and profitable.

In the words of Melissa, "When you focus on working toward your goals with other women, you have so much support, a tribe of women behind you, because they're there to support you and lift you up and help you get to that next level—to achieve your dreams."

It's this unique balance between do-

ing what's right for oneself while serving others that makes cabi so special. "I strive to lead forward in everything Unlike most roads to prosperity—that I do, and having people there to help you push forward, to move those barriers, that's an incredible gift," said cabi Stylist Tonya Body. "As cabi girls, we all have different backgrounds, but we're all like-minded, entrepreneurial women with a purpose: to serve, to do well in our communities, to put others first—that's why I love my cabi business." Every woman involved in the cabi Fashion Experience, from the shoppers to the Hostesses to the Stylists themselves, is part of something much bigger than any individual—something the world is waking up to and taking notice of.

When we think back to that dis-

appointing car ride home from the mall, we can't help but laugh at how little it resembles the shopping experience cabi has created. At the end of a show we observed one evening, we saw women clutching new wardrobes, beaming with a new sense of self. There was laughter and lightness in the cool evening air as they made their way to their cars—made their way back to reality, rested and refreshed. Last to leave was the Stylist, who strode confidently down the driveway, a broad smile spreading across her face. Hers was not merely a smile of success, but a look that radiated purpose and meaning; it's an expression of deep and enduring fulfillment—the kind that comes from being the change you wish to see.

Additionally, as women gain success, they employ members of their communities and send their children to school. And as they repay their loans, their loan turns into an average of 5 more loans over time!

To date. The Heart of cabi Foun-

dation has funded 12,800 small business loans around the world. "We invest in women entrepreneurs because we know when a woman is given the opportunity to better her life, her gut instinct is to also see those around her thrive," said cabi Founder, President, and Chief Culture Officer, Kimberly Inskeep. "As a company of women, we think it's pretty darn cool to be part of the larger sisterhood helping to eliminate extreme poverty. We really believe we can do it!"

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# **HURTS SO GOOD**

The trouble and triumph of being *inspired by passion*

Flamenco dancers and matadors, with their strong, dramatic movements, undeniably evoke a strong sense of passion. It was this iconic imagery from Spain that gave our Creative Team huge inspiration this season, thus our season's theme—inspired by passion.

The word "passion" evokes a sense of strong emotion, intense desire, and unbridled fire. And yet, the word is now so often used to simply refer to things like our favorite sport, hobby, or even food, that we dilute its true meaning and miss its significance. The Latin definition ups the ante, telling us passion means "to suffer for something you love." Anyone who has kids—especially teenagers—might say a hearty "amen," as we eagerly go to painstaking ends out of our love for them.

But what about your life's big passion? Do you have one? That igniting fire that gives clarity to your days, a tenacity that defies logic, and a fulfillment that pushes you ever-forward? You do. And if you haven't uncovered it yet, just look at what makes you mad, sad, and glad. Consider the continuity among your responses, and you may uncover the passion uniquely knit into your heart. You'll find a passion that is likely deeply rooted in others instead of a desire solely for the sake of the self (which always comes up short).

Articulating our passion—the "why" behind our life's purpose—might be one of the most important things we'll ever do. And yet, if we know it in our heads but don't live it out in our bodies, it remains a nice idea—a forever "what if." Passion isn't passion unless there's action.

For us as women, there are strong forces that keep our passion at bay, quenching the fire that may have once burned in our heart. We are held back by our perception around our limits of time, or limits of personal potential, or even more significant in keeping us from pursuing our heart's deepest passion...our perception—our fear—of what others think of us.

And yet, as the Latin definition suggests, pursuits of passion are not filled with pleasantries, but rather discomfort, inconvenience, and roadblocks of a very thorny kind. Any worthy pursuit will ruffle feathers. Any strong emotion, intense desire, or unbridled fire will be met with scrutiny. And so, we choose to stay safe, preserving our passion as an ideal periodically spoken of but never really acted upon.

But when we weigh the costs of safety and comfort versus the triumphs born of true passion, we just may find the inspiration that will fuel our willingness to step into the discomfort of our passion. And in the midst of challenge, we'll encounter the life we've always been meant to live, at that glorious intersection of our deep joy and the world's great need... a life that hurts so good.
